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Intensive ABA

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is an effective, research supported, intervention option for people with developmental disabilities who would benefit from acquiring new skills or who are being held back by problem behaviors.



Intensive Intervention

Individualized

When you enroll with Holdsambeck & Associates, our behavior analysts will design a program to address the specific needs of your family.

You will receive intensive daily intervention by a team of professionals devoted to your family's needs.

As part of this service, you will receive a complete **Functional Behavior Assessment** of abilities and deficits in addition to a corresponding **Behavior Intervention Plan** detailing the recommendations for intervention.

Intensive ABA

Intensive ABA is an effective intervention option, supported by research, to improve outcomes for individuals with developmental disabilities. Intervention is targeted for specific behavioral excesses and deficits and is provided intensively with sessions two to five days a week depending on individual need, age, and family availability.

Intervention may include pre-academic behaviors, communication, social behavior, cooperation, safety awareness, self-care, as well as reduction of any problem behaviors such as aggression, self-injury, tantrums or other problems that may otherwise interfere with success.



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
